## CID Monthly Report

## A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On April 4, 2021 at 0821 hrs., a police officer was flagged down on Washington Avenue by a borough resident who reported through translation that someone had just been robbed on Somerset Street and the victim was at a business on Somerset Street. Patrol responded to that location and met with the victim. The victim stated that while he was walking east on Craig Place approaching Somerset Street, a black BMW occupied by four black males pulled up to him and the driver exited the car wearing a ski mask and threw him to the ground. The suspect attempted to take items from his pocket but was unsuccessful. Bystanders started to gather in the area and the suspect got back in the car and fled east on Pearl Street. Just prior to this, Plainfield had a robbery involving a vehicle with the same description. A short time after this robbery attempt, Plainfield had another robbery at Madison Avenue and West Front Street.

On April 11, 2021 at 0233 hrs., a police officer was flagged down by a citizen who reported hearing multiple gunshots in the area of Gavin Place and Steiner Place. This

was also reported by an employee of a business in the same area. When patrol canvassed the area, eleven shell casings were located at the intersection of Steiner Place and Gavin Place. There was also damage to a vehicle which appeared to be from one of the shots. CID responded and processed the scene and the evidence. No one was injured as a result of the shooting. Several vehicles seen leaving the scene were described but it is unknown if they were involved. The detective assigned to the case received an anonymous tip telling him where the shooter lived, but not the identity of the shooter. The detective spent days checking with businesses and residences in the center of town and around the area of the shooting to obtain any video surveillance that might exist in order to piece together what happened and identify a suspect. After reviewing the video that was obtained, a suspect was developed and later identified by a photo array. The matter was screened by the Somerset County Prosecutor's Office. The suspect who is still at large, was charged with five counts of attempted murder and various weapons charges. He is currently entered in the NCIC system as a wanted person.

On April 15, 2021 at 0623 hrs., patrol responded to a gas Station on Route 22 on the report of a burglary. A station employee stated that he left work on April 14, 2021 at 2200 hrs. When he returned at 0615 hrs. on April 15, 2021, he noticed that the station kiosk was disheveled and there was damage to the cash register. Patrol was able to view the surveillance video. In the video, a male wearing a gray hooded sweat shirt, gloves, and a mask walked past the kiosk and entered the bathroom. The bathroom is connected to the kiosk. The suspect was able to gain entry into the kiosk. The suspect then gained entry to the safe with a pry bar owned by the station. The suspect took approximately \$15,000 in cash and some other items. The suspect was driving a black vehicle and on the video another person was in the vehicle seated behind the driver. This matter is still under investigation.

## Community Outreach

The Community Policing Unit made twenty-two (22) calls to the senior citizens enrolled in the Good Morning Program, and sent out sixteen (16) first time false alarm activation notices and five (5) false alarm notices. Det. Domizi assisted in numerous translations for both patrol & CID. Det. Roberto DeJesus has also been assigned cases in addition to his school duties, including an unlawful weapons possession charge against a middle school student and assisting with firearms background checks.

#### Narcotics Strike Force

The Task Force Officer reported that in April multiple investigations were conducted in Franklin Township. Undercover narcotics activity was also conducted in North Plainfield, Somerville, Franklin, and Bernardsville. The Task Force Officer also attended building clearing training.

#### Other Matters

Detectives continue to investigate all criminal matters within North Plainfield during the pandemic. Detectives conducted four licensing and nine background investigations during the month of April (4-Food Vendors, 3-Firearms, 5-Police applicant, 1-Civilian applicant). CID also tracked 14 Handle with Care notifications made to the school district. Lt. Ciempola conducted one Megan's Law re-registrations.

## Adjudications & Judicial Proceedings

Superior Court was open, however, none of our cases have come up on the calendar yet.
