ADMINISTRATION:

Staffing:

The Police Department is operating below its authorized strength of 48 sworn Officers, and 6 fulltime civilian personnel. Staffing and deficiencies:

- 3 police officers
- 1 Lieutenant's position
- 1 administrative assistant (Records), has been reduced to a 29 hour part-time position.

Injured Officers:

- Officer Brid continued to work on light duty since March 27, due to surgery he had on November 3; a result of an on duty accident he had on December 9, 2014. As of August 31, he was out of work for 74 days and on light duty for 91 days.
- Sergeant McKay suffered serious injuries when he was involved in an off duty motor vehicle accident on February 3. As of June 2, he was out of work 81 days. He started back to work on light duty on June 5, and as of August 31, has been on light duty for 64 days.
- Officer Jean-Baptiste was placed on administrative leave March 6, due to a complaint requiring an investigation. As of August 31, he was out of work for 92 days.
- Officer Mazza, while off duty, suffered a wrist injury on June 4. The injury required surgery, and he has been out of work since. As of August 31, he has been out of work for 44 days.
- Officer DeJesus suffered a finger injury when pursuing an arrestee that attempted to flee from Police headquarters on June 16. He required surgery and was out of work for 33 days. He returned to full duty on August 19.

Promotions, New Hires and Retirements

There were no new hires, promotions or retirements in August.

A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On August 6, 2017, officers tried to serve a defendant with a domestic violence order. Upon arrival to the residence they were advised that he was in the house, a search for the suspect turned up nobody. A second check of the exterior and interior of the house was conducted and as they looked under a deck attached to the house, they located an open window to the basement. Again, the basement was searched and the suspect was located hiding under bedding in the basement. While being led out of the house to a patrol car the suspect told the victim that when he is released he will blow up the house. The case was screened with the Somerset County Prosecutor's Office and a charge of Terroristic Threats was approved. The suspect was taken to the Somerset County Jail and is awaiting the court proceedings.

On August 7, 2017, a business owner reported an attempted burglary to the business. A surveillance camera caught the suspect and an additional one in a different business captured the suspect entering the open business. Snapshots of the suspect were placed on department Facebook page in an attempt to solicit the public's help. Several calls were received to include one from the suspect himself after being told he was on the Internet. The suspect turned himself in and was charged with criminal mischief and is awaiting Municipal Court proceedings.

On August 22, 2017, patrol officers responded to a suspect trying to open car doors and he had already entered one car according to the caller. The area was flooded with patrol officers and the suspect was located. The victim was able to identify the suspect. The suspect was charged with Burglary and Criminal Attempt and released and is awaiting the court proceedings.

On August 25, 2017, a patrol officer was monitoring traffic when he spotted an erratic driver. As he pulled out the vehicle sped off and as the officer tried to close the distance between his vehicle and the violator vehicle, he learned the suspect vehicle had hit a parked car, a pedestrian and came to rest against a telephone pole. The driver and front passenger fled. Other officers located the passenger. The vehicle had been reported stolen in Greenbrook. During the investigation of two other stolen vehicles, a suspect was developed and his picture was shown to an occupant of the vehicle who identified him as the driver. Attempts to have him turn himself in were unsuccessful so a search warrant and arrest warrant were obtained and the suspect was arrested without incident inside his mother's residence. The driver was charged with Aggravated Assault, theft and Receiving Stolen Property. The passenger was charged with Theft and Receiving Stolen Property. Both are awaiting the court proceedings.

Community Outreach

The community police unit sent out 26 False Alarm Activation letters to first time activations and 12 False alarm warning notices. The Good Morning program made 20 calls to the seniors signed up for the program. The community police unit held the annual National Night Out and once again, it was an overwhelming success. Officers from the unit also finished up the STEP program with its annual picnic for the Borough youth.

Narcotics Strike Force

The Narcotics Strike Force spent a total of 12 hours in the Borough following up on reports of illegal narcotic activity in the Boro. In August the Narcotics Strike Force executed search warrants in the county that resulted in the seizure of three pounds of marijuana, four grams of cocaine, \$8,600 in cash and one handgun.

Other Matters

During August the following background investigations were conducted by members of the detective bureau; six firearms, one auto sales, two bingo licenses and five new employee background investigations.

Adjudications & Judicial Proceedings

Members of the Detective Bureau testified before the Superior Court Grand Jury three times in August. On August 7, 2017 the Honorable Judge Cawtherqak of the Somerset County Superior Court sentenced Milton Chrisp to three years in prison for Burglary and Theft. On August 7, 2017 the Honorable Judge Cawtherqak of the Somerset County Superior Court sentenced Jeffrey Sobers to one year in prison for Theft by Deception. On August 25, 2017 the Honorable Judge Cawtherqak of the Somerset County Superior Court sentenced Javon Alleyne to three years in prison for possession of a Controlled Dangerous Substance.
