ADMINISTRATION:

Staffing:

The Police Department is operating below its authorized strength of 48 sworn Officers, and 6 fulltime civilian personnel. Staffing and deficiencies:

- 2 police officers
- 1 Lieutenant's position
- 1 administrative assistant (Records), has been reduced to a 29 hour part-time position.

Injured Officers:

- Officer Brid continued to work on light duty since March 27, 2017, due to surgery he had on November 3, 2016; a result of an on duty accident he had on December 9, 2014. As January 31, he was out of work for 74 days and on light duty for 200 days.
- Officer DeJesus underwent surgery on January 22, for a work related injury in 2017. As of January 31, he was out of work 6 days.
- Officer Jean-Baptiste was placed on administrative leave March 6, 2017, due to a complaint requiring an investigation. As of January 31, he was out of work for 165 days.

Promotions, New Hires and Retirements:

CID Monthly Report

A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On January 8, 2018 members of our department assisted with an investigation into a stolen car from Watchung, NJ. During the investigation, it was learned that the suspect lived in North Plainfield. Patrol officers did a drive by of the suspect's home and located the stolen vehicle. Detectives converged on the residence and after a short while a search warrant was obtained. During the search of the garage and the property numerous parts of stolen vehicles were identified for a total of seven different vehicles. The case is being screened with the Somerset County Prosecutor's Office and it has turned into a much larger investigation into a possible "chop shop" operation.

Community Outreach

During January, the Community Policing unit was featured on WPIX Channel 11 News for First Responders week. Narcotics Strike Force

During January, the strike force spent 22 man-hours in town conducting surveillance and following up on citizens' complaints of suspected narcotic violations around town. Two search warrants were executed with a total of five pounds of marijuana seized at one location and five bricks of heroin, \$5,000.00 in US currency and one bottle of liquid methadone seized at the second search warrant location.

Members of the detective bureau did the following background investigations for January 2018; three firearms applications, one new boro employee, one bingo investigation and one sidewalk café check.

Members of the Detective Bureau testified before the Grand Jury five times during January.
