ADMINISTRATION:

Staffing:

The Police Department is operating below its authorized strength of 48 sworn Officers and 6 full-time civilian personnel. Staffing and deficiencies:

- 1 Lieutenant's position
- 1 Patrol Officer

Injured Officers/Officers on Leave:

- Officer Jean-Baptiste was placed on administrative leave March 6, 2017, due to a complaint requiring an investigation. As of January 31, 2020, he was out of work for 665 days.
- Officer Roberto DeJesus was injured on duty on August 2, 2019 during a motor vehicle stop. As of January 27, 2020, he was cleared for light duty. He was out of patrol type work for 102 days.
- Officer Jesus Medina went out on sick leave with an off-duty injury on January 12, 2020. He has been out of work for 11 days.

Promotions, New Hires and Retirements:

There were no promotions, new hires or retirements during January of 2020.

CID Monthly Report

A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On January 8, 2020 at approximately 3:00 AM, police responded to an apartment located on Somerset Street after receiving a 911 call reporting a possible stabbing. On arrival, police found two victims bleeding from various stab and slash wounds. Police discovered through investigation that this was actually a domestic dispute that was elevated when one subject armed themselves with a knife. The female victim told officers that her husband had attacked her and then used the weapon on himself. The female victim applied for and was granted a temporary protection order (TRO) from a Judge. The male suspect admitted to police during an interview that he had attacked his wife and then used the knife on himself. The Somerset County Prosecutor's Office authorized charges of aggravated assault against the suspect and he was lodged in the Somerset County Jail awaiting a hearing.

On January 14, 2020 at approximately 2:00 AM, patrol officers responded to Sandford Ave on the report of a vehicle that had been burglarized. As officers were on scene it was discovered that several other vehicles in the immediate area had also been burglarized. Detectives responded and began collecting video surveillance from multiple residences in the area that showed two suspects had been responsible for the burglaries. Police were also able to track the suspects as they used stolen credit cards to make purchases at various local businesses. Police were able to identify two female suspects that reside in Plainfield, New Jersey. The suspects were located and transported to police headquarters where they agreed to provide statements to police. In a post Miranda statement, both suspects admitted to burglarizing over 30 vehicles in North Plainfield & Plainfield during the moths of December and January. The Somerset County Prosecutor's Office was contacted and charges were authorized against both defendants for 3rd degree burglary and 3rd degree theft. The matter has been scheduled for Superior Court.

On January 26, 2020 at approximately 10:15 PM, officers responded to a business located along Route 22 West on the report of a female lying in the parking lot next to a parked vehicle. On arrival, officers found a semi-conscious female suffering from an apparent single gunshot wound to the chest. EMS was summoned and officers quickly located a loaded handgun near the female. Officers provided lifesaving measures to the victim by applying direct pressure to the wound. The scene was secured and investigators responded to examine the evidence as the victim was rushed to a trauma center for her injuries. The victim unfortunately expired during surgery at the hospital from her injuries. Investigators located evidence in and around the vehicle that indicated the victim had died from a single self-inflicted gunshot wound. The investigation entailed collecting video surveillance, phone records, and post mortem reports.

Community Outreach

The Community Policing unit made seventeen (17) calls to the senior citizens enrolled in the Good Morning program, and sent out (46) first time false alarm activation notices. Det. Domizi assisted in numerous translations for both patrol & CID. Det. Fowler retired from NPPD on January 31st. Det. Ryan Mote has already begun teaching GREAT & DARE to our students. Det. Mote has officially begun his assignment as the new School Resource Officer.

Narcotics Strike Force

During the month of January, the Task Force Officer conducted 12 man hours of dedicated narcotics surveillance in North Plainfield. The Task Force Officer & Strike Force also conducted controlled narcotics purchases in North Plainfield on at least two dates in January.

Other Matters

Detectives investigated seven (7) licensing/background applications during the month of January, (2- Firearms, 2- Coin Operated Amusement, 1- Raffle, 1- Limousine Owner and 1- Vendor). In January, CID obtained a vehicle exclusively for undercover use by the department. The vehicle will be switched out frequently throughout the year. In January, members of CID attended a meeting regarding the usage and implementation of the E-Agent Web-Based Software which will replace NCIC 2000 and CJIS in the near future. Lt. McKay attended the annual law Enforcement & Educator's Conference which emphasized the Standard Response protocol. Lt. McKay registered two Megan's Law offenders during the month of January. Detectives attended mandatory agency training on January 10, 2020 on topics covering workplace harassment. Lt. McKay attended the quarterly SART Board meeting on January 21, 2020.

Adjudications & Judicial Proceedings

Det. Mazza appeared in Grand Jury on January 17, 2020, and Det. Everett appeared in Grand Jury on January 22, 2020. Both cases were voted True Bill by the Grand Jury and indictments were handed down.

Milton Chrisp pled guilty to burglary and is presently awaiting sentencing in Superior Court. Michael Poltorak pled guilty to a 2009 robbery and is also awaiting sentencing.
