- Officer Roberto DeJesus was injured on duty on August 2, 2019 during a motor vehicle stop. As of January 27, 2020, he was cleared for light duty. As of July 22, 2020, he has been out of patrol type work for 178 days. He was cleared and returned to full duty on July 23, 2020.

CID Monthly Report

#### A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On July 14, 2020 at approximately 0110 hrs., patrol officers responded to a residence on Rock Avenue for a domestic dispute. During the dispute, the male actor picked up his one year old child and decided to go for a walk to cool off. The male parties' mother accompanied him on the walk. The female party, the mother of the one year old, had initially decided to decline a TRO. A short time later, she changed her mind and decided to apply for a TRO. Later that morning at approximately 1031 hrs., the child's mother called the police and reported the one year old child missing. CID immediately became involved and activated the CART team. The investigation revealed the one year old child's father and his mother never returned after they went for a walk the night before. In the interim, the child's mother obtained a TRO granting her full child custody. Our detectives coordinated with the CART team. Our detectives had the father's phone pinged six times. It was eventually determined that the father, his mother, and the child were at a restaurant in another jurisdiction which was verified by the child's mother because of a photograph sent to her phone. Another law enforcement agency was notified and responded to the restaurant with a TRO. Our detectives responded to that location and the child was turned over to the mother pursuant to the TRO.

On July 16, 2020 at approximately 1440 hrs., a male entered a business on Watchung Avenue wearing a green shirt and jeans and stole an item from inside the store. The male was in possession of a metal pipe. A suspect fitting the description was stopped by a patrol officer in a municipal parking lot in Plainfield in possession of the stolen item and a three foot long pipe. A detective interviewed the complainant who told him that the suspect used to be a regular customer in the store, but he had been banned from coming to the store for unruly behavior and attempting to steal items in the past. When he entered the store on this date, he was told he had to leave and became argumentative. The suspect then grabbed an item and left the store. Another employee followed to attempt to retrieve the stolen item and the suspect picked up the metal pipe and swung it at him making him believe he would be struck by the pipe. The suspect was later interviewed by the detective and gave a statement. The Somerset County Prosecutor's Office was contacted and the suspect was charged with Robbery 2<sup>nd</sup> degree.

On July 23, 2020 at approximately 0743 hrs., a man walked into police headquarters to report that he had been assaulted and robbed in the area of Grove Street and the Plainfield city line at approximately 0530 hrs. by five males who struck him from behind, causing him to fall down and become unconscious. When he regained consciousness, he realized that his wallet and phone were stolen. While this statement was being taken, a patrol officer reported seeing a group fitting that description in that area. As that officer checked on Front Street in Plainfield, he observed a member of that group assaulting a male. As the officer intervened in the assault several of the males walked away quickly. Detectives and other officers and the Plainfield Police located the males in the area just west of where the assault was occurring and three suspects were taken into custody. They were later found to have proceeds from the robbery on them. The Somerset County Prosecutor's Office was contacted and three male juveniles were charged with Robbery 2nd degree and lodged in the Middlesex County Juvenile Detention center. Those three, along with two others, were also suspects in Plainfield for assaults on other victims.

#### Community Outreach

The Community Policing Unit made eleven (11) calls to the senior citizens enrolled in the Good Morning Program, and sent out eighteen (18) first time false alarm activation notices and twelve (12) false alarm notices. Det. Domizi assisted in numerous translations for both patrol & CID. Det. Mote was temporarily assigned to the Services Division to assist with a back log of firearms applications.

#### Narcotics Strike Force

The Task Force Officer has returned to the Task Force. The first day back the officer was sworn in and received orientation. He also received additional training in Tactical Combat Casualty Care and Room Clearing. Undercover buys were made in several Somerset County towns, including North Plainfield. Information regarding possible narcotic activity at certain borough addresses have been passed forward to the Task Force Officer.

#### Other Matters

Detectives continue to investigate all criminal matters within North Plainfield during the pandemic. Detectives conducted thirteen licensing and background investigations during the month of July (10-Firearms, 1-Vendor, 1-Police Applicant, 1-Cafe).

# Adjudications & Judicial Proceedings

Superior Court began virtual first appearances in June due to the health pandemic. No trials were conducted but they are expected to be scheduled soon.
