#### **ADMINISTRATION:**

#### Staffing:

The Police Department is operating below its authorized strength of 48 sworn Officers, and 6 fulltime civilian personnel. Staffing and deficiencies:

- 3 police officers
- 1 Lieutenant's position
- 2 administrative assistants (chief and records), have been reduced to 29 hour parttime positions.

# Injured Officers:

- Officer Brid continued to work on light duty since March 27, due to surgery he had on November 3; a result of an on duty accident he had on December 9, 2014. As of June 30, he was out of work for 74 days and on light duty for 60 days.
- Sergeant McKay suffered serious injuries when he was involved in an off duty motor vehicle accident on February 3. As of June 2, he was out of work 81 days. He started back to work on light duty on June 5, and as of June 30 has been on light duty for 20 days.
- Officer Jean-Baptiste was placed on administrative leave March 6, due to a complaint requiring an investigation. As of June 30, he was out of work for 63 days.
- Officer Mazza, while off duty, suffered a wrist injury on June 4. The injury required surgery, and he has been out of work since. As of June 30, he has been out of work for 12 days.
- Officer DeJesus suffered a finger injury when pursuing an arrestee that attempted to flee from Police headquarters on June 16. He required surgery and has been out of work since. As of June 30 he has been out of work for 7 days.

#### Promotions, New Hires and Retirements

• There were no new hires, promotions, or retirements in June.

#### A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On June 6, 2017 a Mountain Avenue resident reported having his paycheck mailed to his residence and at some point noticed he never received it. He then reported the check stolen and an investigation started. It was learned where the check was cashed and a clear picture of the suspect was obtained. The victim or any of the members of the police department did not know the suspect. A Facebook post was made asking for the public's help in identifying the suspect. A short time later an anonymous call was received and the suspect was identified and confirmed by an investigation by a detective. Contact was made with the suspect who gave a post Miranda statement confirming that he took the check and cashed it as he was desperate for money at the time. The suspect was charged

with third degree Forgery, third degree Uttering a Forged Document and fourth degree Theft by Deception. The suspect is awaiting court proceedings.

On June 13, 2017 a resident reported a Burglary to her vehicle where a laptop was among the stolen items. A known burglar was stopped in another jurisdiction after being seen trying to sell a laptop to two separate businesses. Our agency was contacted and the victim was able to provide the password to unlock the computer. The suspect was charged in the other jurisdiction with receiving stolen property and the case was sent to the Somerset County Prosecutors Office for screening for the charge of Burglary and Criminal Mischief in our town.

On June 24, 2017 a resident reported a delivered package stolen from a porch. The resident has a home surveillance system and recorded the suspect taking the package. The suspect who is known to this agency as a serial package thief was charged with the theft of the package and is awaiting court proceedings.

NOTE: We are required by the Rules of Court to include herein a statement explaining that the charges are merely an accusation and that the defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
