CID Monthly Report

A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On June 3, 2021 at 2336 hrs., Ptl. Johnson was on a motor vehicle stop on Myrtle Avenue when he was approached by a male borough resident. The man told him that he observed what he believed was a robbery. Ptl. Johnson located the male victim and through translation told the officer that he was walking home in the area of Craig Place and Duer Street when he noticed that he was being followed by three black males. When he got to Prospect Place near his house, they attacked him and attempted to rob him. He was able to fight them off and they fled running behind a house on Prospect Place. They eventually ran south on Washington Avenue towards Plainfield. CID was notified and patrol noted that there are several surveillance cameras on houses in the area.

On June 7, 2021 at 0527 hrs., patrol responded to Washington Avenue and the Plainfield City line on the report of a robbery. Plainfield Police Officers were on the scene with the male victim from Myrtle Avenue, North Plainfield. They reported that he was walking south on the east side of Washington Avenue toward Plainfield when a black male in a black SUV pulled up and got out of the car. The suspect asked him for a dollar. When he pulled out his wallet, he was punched in the face by the suspect. The two struggled for the victim's wallet and the suspect kept assaulting the victim. The suspect got the wallet, took the cash, and then dropped the wallet. He got back in the SUV and fled north on Washington Avenue. The victim described the suspect as 5'7", medium build, with no facial hair. The victim had injuries to his left eye, nose, and a small laceration to his lip.

EMS was called, but the victim refused further medical attention. The victim said that about \$300.00 in cash was taken from his wallet.

On June 16, 2021, patrol responded to a car dealership in the borough and spoke with an investigator for the dealership. He reported that three cars were stolen by three different suspects. A customer who provided false identification, was able to purchase a used vehicle for \$25,855.47. The suspect financed the car and presented a New York State identification to purchase the vehicle. The identification was a fake and no payments have been made on the vehicle. The investigator checked with the finance company and the financing was cancelled. Another suspect using the same method was able to complete the purchase of another vehicle using a Pennsylvania identification card and also arranged for financing. After the vehicle was purchased, the financing was cancelled. Finally, a third vehicle valued at \$33,017.27 was stolen using the same method by another individual using a fake New York identification and the same method. In total, seven vehicles were stolen using the same method. CID investigated the matter with assistance from the Major Crimes Unit of the Somerset County Prosecutor's Office and most of the vehicles have been recovered.

Community Outreach

The Community Policing Unit made twenty (20) calls to the senior citizens enrolled in the Good Morning Program, and sent out nineteen (19) first time false alarm activation notices and eleven (11) false alarm notices. Det. Domizi assisted in numerous translations for both patrol & CID. Det. Roberto DeJesus has also been assigned cases in addition to his school duties and other duties related to his position. Det. DeJesus also provided security during the high school and middle school graduations.

Narcotics Strike Force

The Task Force Officer reported that in June he was involved with one wiretap investigation, which concluded with the execution of search warrants at locations throughout Somerset, Middlesex, and Union counties. A roundup occurred at the conclusion of that investigation. His work also included a prostitution sting operation in Hillsborough and surveillance of suspected narcotics trafficking in North Plainfield.

Other Matters

CID is now tracking activity at all licensed liquor establishments to ensure compliance with ABC guidelines. Det/Sgt. von Spreckelsen is preparing quarterly reports for the Chief of Police, identifying issues at the various bars and restaurants. Detectives conducted seven licensing investigations during the month of June (6-Firearms, 2-Car Dealer, 1-Vendor, and 1-Police applicant background check). CID also tracked 10 Handle with Care notifications made to the school district. Lt. Ciempola conducted two Megan's Law re-registrations and one new registration of a tier one offender.

Adjudications & Judicial Proceedings

Superior Court was open, however, none of our cases have come up on the calendar yet. We had several appearances in Grand Jury.
