CID Monthly Report

A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On June 6, 2022 at 1915 hrs., patrol responded to an anonymous phone call about package theft in the area of Warfield Road and Redmont Road. The caller related that a male got out of a vehicle, approached the residence, picked up a package from the front of the residence, and got back into the vehicle. The caller observed the vehicle turn towards Vermeule Park. Police later observed an unoccupied black Subaru parked at the park. Later, five males were seen leaving the park and it was later determined that those individuals exited that vehicle. Prior to entering the park, the officer was able to look inside the vehicle and in plain view he observed black Nike Airforce 1 high tops on the front passenger floor and an open Amazon package in the middle of the rear seat. After determining the identity of the victim of theft, the officer reviewed the surveillance video from that address and identified the suspect who stole the package. The suspect, a juvenile, was taken into custody and transported to police headquarters. The suspect was processed and released to a family member pending charges.

On June 9, 2022 at 0512 hrs., patrol responded to a business on Watchung Avenue near Pearl Street for the report of a young juvenile found walking by herself. The four year old female was transported to headquarters and an effort was made to go door-to-door in the area to locate her address. A detective was assigned to assist patrol and after two

hours of no reports from anyone, the child was driven around the area to see if she could identify any house or location to be searched. Plainfield Police were contacted and notified of the recovery of the child in the event they received any missing person reports and DCPP was also notified. At some point the child was driven by a day care center on Westervelt Avenue in Plainfield and reacted to that location by saying, "escuela". Officers checked that location and the teachers in the school identified the child and gave the parent's contact information to the officers. The child's mother was contacted at her work and responded to headquarters. DCPP also arrived at headquarters. It was determined that the child was dropped off at her aunt's house at 0400 hrs. on Chatham Place. The aunt took the child to bed with her and the child got up and walked out of the house. DCPP arrived and conferred with the officers and the detective and determined that the child could be returned to her mother.

On June 26, 2022 at 0018 hrs., patrol responded to an address on Craig Place for a report of a disorderly male. On arrival, the officer located a male victim who was completely covered in blood. It was determined that he had been assaulted by three black male suspects who came to his house after he had an argument with one of them on the phone over him calling his ex-girlfriend numerous times that day. According to the victim, a male party took the phone from his ex-girlfriend and told him to stop calling her and he knows where he lives. After that conversation, he heard a knock on the door and three black males were at the door. He closed the door and ran into his kitchen. The suspects kicked in the door and chased him into the kitchen where one of the males grabbed a frying pan and hit him in the head with it repeatedly, causing bumps and lacerations. Before they left, the suspects stole his cell phone. NPFD responded and the victim was transported to RWJ New Brunswick for treatment.
