The following is a report of the activities of the North Plainfield Police Department for the month. The Divisions of the Department divide the report.

ADMINISTRATION:

Staffing:

The Police Department is operating below its authorized strength of 48 sworn Officers, and 6 fulltime civilian personnel. Staffing and deficiencies:

- 3 police officers
- 1 Lieutenant's position
- 2 administrative assistants (chief and records) have been reduced to 29 hour parttime positions.

Injured Officers:

• No Officer injuries reported during March.

Promotions, New Hires and Retirements

- On March 14, Ashley Straile started as a dispatcher with the North Plainfield Police Department.
- On March 22, Officer Jordan Rogers graduated from the Camden County Police Academy.
- There were no promotions during the month of March.

A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On February 19, 2016 at approximately 3:41 PM patrol units responded to a residence on Cedar Street for a burglary attempt where the suspects were fleeing on foot. Upon arrival a perimeter was set up and one suspect, a female juvenile, was located and taken into custody. On March 17, 2016 the second suspect, an adult male, was brought in for questioning and confessed to going to the residence with the juvenile in an attempt to get money back from a resident that stole money from the female juvenile. Both suspects were charged with third degree Burglary, Criminal Attempt, Possession of Burglary tools and disorderly persons offense of Criminal Mischief. The juvenile will have her case heard in family court and the adult male was released on bail and is awaiting Superior Court proceedings.

On February 26, 2016 a resident of Greenbrook Rd reported the theft of two rings with an approximate value of \$1500.00. The victim suspected her daughter and an unknown male as the suspects. The rings were located at a pawn shop in Middlesex, NJ and returned to the victim. The suspects were located and arrested after questioning and both were charged with third degree Burglary and Theft. Both are awaiting Superior Court Proceedings.

Community Outreach

The community policing unit participated in Read Across America and read to school age children. Detective Domizi attended the North Plainfield Community Forum meeting and the North Plainfield Business Association meeting. He also assisted the department by conducting 10 Spanish to English translations and made 4 Good Morning Program telephone calls to senior citizens in the program. 31 False alarm 1st notices were sent out along with 6 False alarm warnings.

Narcotics Strike Force

Officer Kropewnicki and the Narcotics Strike Force worked several cases in town during March leading to arrests on both the East End of town and the West End of town for both heroin and cocaine. One arrest here led to a case where a person in Franklin Township was arrested for MDMA distribution. Another case put together here has led to information of a male supplying substantial amount of narcotics in town. On March 29, 2016 the task force acting on information executed a search warrant and recovered handguns, drugs and other burglary proceeds and arrested MS-13 gang members for the crimes

Other Matters

During March the detectives did two raffle investigations, 6 firearm background investigations, four taxi license investigations, 2 ice cream vendor investigations, one liquor investigation and one outdoor café investigation.

Adjudications & Judicial Proceedings

Members of the department participated in a jury trial for Murder from a case in town where the suspect was found guilty of 2nd degree murder with sentencing scheduling for May 13, 2016.

On March 11, 2016 Jose Santana was sentenced to one year in prison for an assault investigated by us where a knife was shown. The presiding judge was Honorable Cawtherqak.

During March the detectives testified before the Grand Jury in Superior Court on 3 occasions, in the above mentioned Murder trial and in different hearings 6 times.
