# Staffing:

The Police Department is operating below its authorized strength of 48 sworn Officers, and 6 fulltime civilian personnel. Staffing and deficiencies:

- 3 police officers
- 1 Lieutenant's position
- 2 administrative assistants (chief and records), have been reduced to 29 hour parttime positions.

# Injured Officers:

- Officer Brid returned to work on light duty March 27, due to a surgery he had on November 3; a result of an on duty accident he had on December 9, 2014. As of March 31, he was out of work for 74 days and on light duty for 5 days.
- Sergeant McKay suffered serious injuries when he was involved in an off duty motor vehicle accident on February 3. As of March 31, he was out of work 40 days.

# A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On March 1, 2017 officers responded to a call of a group chasing a male. Upon arrival it was determined that the male being chased had just robbed a taxi driver. The driver stated that the male was dropped off at a destination and then pulled out a knife and demanded the drivers money. The driver was then cut in the neck with the knife. The suspect was arrested and charged with Aggravated Assault, Robbery, Possession of a Weapon and Possession of a Weapon for an Unlawful Purpose and is currently awaiting the court process.

On March 19, 2017 officers responded to the call of a robbery. A male walking was approached by another male who displayed a gun and demanded money and his cell phone. The suspect fled to a waiting car that was seen driving out of town and was stopped by members of the patrol division. The driver matched description and a gun was located. The suspect gave a post Miranda statement where he confessed to the crime

as he was desperate for money. The suspect was charged with Robbery and Possession of Controlled Dangerous Substance. He is currently awaiting the court process.

On March 28, 2017 officers responded to a robbery where the suspect displayed a handgun while demanding money and forced the victim into his residence. Inside the residence the suspect was overtaken by two victims and the police were called. At the residence police recovered the handgun and the suspect was taken into custody. The handgun was reported stolen out of Virginia. The suspect was charged with Robbery, Burglary, Unlawful Possession of a Firearm, Possession of a Firearm for Unlawful Purpose and Receiving Stolen Property. He is currently awaiting the court process.

## Community Outreach

Members of the Department to include the Community Policing Unit participated in Read Across America in March. The unit also sent out 32 False Alarm Activation letters to first time activations and 5 False alarm warning notices.

#### Narcotics Strike Force

The Narcotics Strike Force were in town for 15 hours doing surveillance and conducting follow up interviews on complaints received from residents. They also executed several search warrants in neighboring towns that resulted in the seizure of three grams of cocaine, 10 pounds of marijuana, a large amount of molly pills – synthetic marijuana and 8 pounds of hash pills.

# Adjudications & Judicial Proceedings

On March 10, 2017 the Honorable Judge Cawtherquak of the Somerset County Superior Court sentenced Kelly Duncan to one year in prison for possession of crack cocaine.

On March 13, 2017 the Honorable Judge Ballard of the Somerset County Superior Court sentenced Shaquita R Booker to one year in prison for the theft of a car on November 5, 2011.

Also on March 13, 2017 the Honorable Judge Cawtherquak of the Somerset County Superior Court sentenced Vonetta Sterling-Sargent to 5 years in prison for her role in a robbery on November 9, 2015.
