#### **ADMINISTRATION:**

# Staffing:

The Police Department is operating below its authorized strength of 48 sworn Officers, and 6 fulltime civilian personnel. Staffing and deficiencies:

- 4 police officers
- 1 Lieutenant's position
- 2 administrative assistants (chief and records) have been reduced to 29 hour parttime positions.

# A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On October 4, 2016 a business on the highway reported 6 large glass panel windows shattered upon opening the business. The business estimated the damage to be approximately \$5500.00. An investigation was conducted and a suspect was identified, located and interviewed where after a while he admitted to doing the damage. The case was screened with the Somerset County Prosecutors Office and the suspect was charged and released and is currently awaiting the court process.

On October 10, 2016 an investigation was started for the theft of a delivered package left outside the residence. The suspect was located several blocks away, stopped and arrested. The property was recovered and returned to the resident and the suspect was charged at the Municipal Level for theft and turned over to the Somerset County Jail on bail.

On October 13, 2016 a Borough business reported a burglary to a company vehicle with construction tools taken by the suspect. During the course of the investigation a suspect was identified and located. The suspect confessed to the crime and was able to direct detectives towards the location of the stolen equipment. The equipment was located and returned to the business and the case was screened with the Somerset County Prosecutors Office. The suspect was charged and released and is currently awaiting the court process.

On October 20, 2016 a resident was the victim of an online scam where he sent money via Western Union and received nothing in return for the payment of US funds. During the investigation the suspect was identified and located out of state. A summons was sent to the suspect to answer in the North Plainfield Municipal Court for this incident.

# Community Outreach

Operation Good Morning continues to call Boro senior citizens that have signed up for the program. The agency was present at the school for a health fair. Detective Domizi sent out 15 first time false alarm notices and 6 false alarm warnings to businesses and residents that have violated the boro ordinance. Detective Domizi also did 12 Spanish to English translations for the department.

Narcotics Strike Force

The Narcotics Strike Force spent approximately 58 man hours in the Boro doing surveillance and gathering information on narcotic activity. During that time several citizen complaints were addressed with members of the Strike Force speaking directly to the citizen complainants. A follow up to an investigation led to a motor vehicle stop with 1.2 kilos of cocaine seized and the arrest of the suspect.

#### Other Matters

Detective Segeda instructed mandatory agency wide refresher training for the ASP baton, OC spray and tactical handcuffing on two separate dates in October. Three background investigations for Firearm Identification Cards and one raffle background investigation for a raffle were completed in October.

## Adjudications & Judicial Proceedings

Anthony Tucceri was sentenced to one year in prison by Superior Court Judge Cawtherqak in October based on a theft investigation and the subsequent arrest and recovery of the stolen property. Members of the Detective Bureau testified in one Superior Court Hearing and once before the Municipal Court in October.
