Prostate Cancer Awareness Month

Whereas, This year, approximately 288,300 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in the United States alone and roughly 34,700 will die this year from the disease; and

Whereas, In New Jersey, an estimated 9,460 new cases of prostate cancer will be diagnosed and an estimated 730 deaths will occur in 2023; and

Whereas, Men with relatives with a history of prostate cancer are twice as likely to develop the disease; and

Whereas, Prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in American Men and the third leading cause of cancer death behind lung and colon cancer; and

Whereas, 1 in 8 men are diagnosed with prostate cancer in their lifetime and 1 in 6 African American men will develop prostate cancer in their lifetime. Overall, African American men are 1.7 times more likely to be diagnosed with - and 2.1 times more likely to die from prostate cancer than white men; and

Whereas, Veterans who were exposed to herbicides like Agent Orange are at increased risk for developing prostate cancer, and are more likely to have an aggressive form of the disease; and

Whereas, Education regarding prostate cancer and early detection strategies is critical to saving lives, preserving, and protecting our families; and

Whereas, If caught early, prostate cancer has a five-year survival rate of nearly 100%. However, for late stage prostate cancer the five-year survival rate is 31%; and

Whereas, All men are at risk for prostate cancer and we encourage the citizens of North Plainfield to recognize the importance of awareness and screenings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED;

That I, Lawrence La Ronde, do hereby proclaim the month of September, 2023 to be **Prostate Cancer Awareness Month** in North Plainfield.

Sewer Capital Improvements (\$248,000 proposed this year) are paid for out of the Sewer Utility which is a "self-liquidating" utility, meaning that it funds debt and operating expenses entirely from its revenues, separate from the Municipal Budget.
