WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield is in need of a mode and manner by which it can collect its residential recyclable material; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield, by ordinance, has enacted a recycling plan for all recyclable materials as designated by the Somerset County Solid Waste Management Plan and amendments thereto; and,

WHEREAS, the County of Somerset Department of Public Works is authorized to provide recycling collection and disposal services to municipalities within Somerset County, including the Borough of North Plainfield; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield is desirous of retaining the services of the County of Somerset Department of Public Works for said recycling program and,

WHEREAS, by letter dated December 20, 2023, Melissa D. Harvey, Manager of the Somerset County Department of Public Works Solid Waste Management submitted a recycling agreement for the period commencing January 1, 2024 through and including December 31, 2024 engaging the County of Somerset Department of Public Works to be responsible for residential curbside pick-up for all recyclable materials from each residential household within the Borough; and,

WHEREAS, the award of this contract to the County, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 13:1E-99.14 is an exception to the bidding requirements as set forth in the Local Public Contracts Law, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:11-5(2) and the Board of Public Utilities Somerset Waste Franchise for Somerset County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of North Plainfield, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that the Borough Council hereby authorizes the Mayor and the Deputy Borough Clerk or designee, on behalf of the Borough, to sign and/or execute the Agreement received from the County of Somerset Department of Public works via letter dated December 20, 2023, for a period commencing January 1, 2024 through and including December 31, 2024. RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH TO ACCEPT A PROPOSAL FROM GROTTO ENGINEERING ASSOCIATES, L.L.C., RELATED TO PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING WORK ON AN HOURLY BASIS FOR PAVEMENT, SIDEWALK, CURB AND DRAINAGE IMPROVMENTS TO FAIRVIEW AVENUE FROM SOMERSET STREET TO DELACY AVENUE IN AN AGGREGATE AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED NINETY-TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS AND NO CENTS (\$92,500.00) AND FOR THE MAYOR AND ACTING BOROUGH CLERK TO EXECUTE ALL DOCUMENTS TO EFFECTUATE SAME.

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield is in need of certain improvements to Fairview Avenue from Somerset Street to Delacy Avenue in the Borough, including paving, sidewalk, curb and drainage improvements (the "Project"), as part of the Borough's maintenance and improvement of its streets through NJDOT 2024 grants; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield has received a proposal from Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C., dated January 8, 2024, to provide professional engineering services for the Project, including gathering field data for layout and dimensions, bid design documents and bid support, construction observation and contract administration for an hourly fee not to exceed a certain amount; and,

WHEREAS, upon completing the field observations, Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. will develop mapping, detailed design drawings, technical specifications and bid documents to provide for the milling, repaving and miscellaneous repairs for the Project at the identified Borough locations, as well as through the field observations. The specifications and construction plans will be compiled in the public bid format following the *NJDOT Standards for Road and Bridge Construction, latest edition,* and developed using AutoCAD. Design drawings will be presented to the Borough for review and comments prior to bidding. Bid Packages will be sold by Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. from their Clark office; they will then review all bids and provide recommendation of an award to the Borough; and,

WHEREAS, Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. has submitted a proposal in the amount of an hourly fee not to exceed Forty Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars and No Cents (\$47,500.00) for the aforementioned bid design documents and an amount as an hourly fee not to exceed Forty Five Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$45,000.00) for the aforementioned bid support, contract administration, construction observation services and testing, for an aggregate total price for all services not to exceed Ninety Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars and No Cents (\$92,500.00); and,

WHEREAS, upon an award of contract(s) by the Borough, Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. will prepare the contract documents and conduct a pre-construction meeting with the contractor, all appropriate Borough personnel and any affected utility companies. During the course of construction, Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. will provide construction observation and administration

services to insure that the selected contractor is performing all construction in full accordance with the project plans and specifications; and,

WHEREAS, Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. will review and approve all payment vouchers submitted by the contractor before they are presented for the Borough for payment. Prior to completion, Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. will also provide the contractor with a detailed punch list of the items requiring repair and/or corrections.

CID Monthly Report

A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On November 20, 2023 at 1525 hrs., officers responded to a residence on a report of a dispute and one of the individuals may be in possession of firearm. When the officers arrived, they learned that this dispute stemmed from a couple that were separating and the female half hired a locksmith to enter a garage. An officer observed the locksmith attempting to climb a fence into the yard and ordered him to stop and inquired about a gun. The locksmith related that he had a gun in a satchel that he wore across his chest. After the satchel was handed over to officers, a consent to search was obtained and a loaded Glock pistol and a high-capacity magazine were located. The resident of that address reported that the locksmith pointed the firearm at him and loaded a round in the chamber. The suspect was arrested and after the incident was screened, he was charged with several weapons offenses and transported to the Somerset County Jail.

On November 25, 2023 at 2120 hrs., patrol responded to bar for a man with a gun. Officers detained a suspect and through the investigation determined that the suspect had a BB gun in his possession. According to a security guard, a male patron sat down at the bar next to the suspect. At some point, the suspect pulled the BB gun out and pressed it into the ribs of the patron and said, "No one scares me." The victim then told security about what happened. A detective was dispatched and took a statement from the victim. The suspect was charged with unlawful possession of a weapon and was lodged in the Somerset County Jail.

On November 27, 2023 at 0640 hrs., patrol responded to a business on Route 22 West on a report of an activated burglar alarm coming from the front door. Upon their arrival, officers found the front glass door smashed by a rock. Officers conducted an interior check of the building for a suspect with negative results. They also found that the register area had been ransacked and many of the computer component wires were cut, laying on the floor, along with the monitors, credit card receipt machines, and the drawers for the cash insert. A detective conducted a follow-up investigation and a bulletin was put out to surrounding agencies with an image of the suspect. Subsequently, the suspect was arrested in another town committing a similar burglary and was also charged with the burglary in North Plainfield.
