I. GENERAL PROJECT INFORMATION

A. Please provide a detailed description of this project, including the scope of the work to be done, steps taken to date, and why the project is necessary. (**Please limit response to one page.**)

The Borough of North Plainfield consistently invests in the maintenance, rehabilitation, and repair of its sanitary sewer infrastructure, most of which was constructed between 70 and 100 years ago, in order to limit disruptions to residents' sewer service. Under this project, the Borough is proposing to continue its efforts by rehabilitating portions of the aged sanitary sewer infrastructure north of Route 22 in the vicinity of Watchung Avenue, Jennings Lane, and adjacent streets.

The project area encompasses approximately 4,900 linear feet of 8-inch diameter clay pipe, and twenty-one (21) manholes. Based on the findings from previously completed closed-circuit television (CCTV) inspection of sanitary sewer gravity main within this area, the Borough proposes to rehabilitate this sewer with priority to selective replacement of defective sewer, internal rehabilitation of sanitary sewer, and internal rehabilitation of manholes. The project's scope of work would also include engineering investigation and design services for the rehabilitation, procurement of a construction contract to complete the project, and engineering supervision of construction activities during the performance of project work. While quantities may vary subject to findings of pre-design inspection in the project area, the work is tentatively anticipated to consist of selective replacement of forty (40) linear feet of existing 8-inch diameter pipe with new SDR 35 PVC pipe, Cured-In-Place Pipe (CIPP) lining of 1,200 linear feet of 8-inch diameter clay pipe, and internal rehabilitation of two manholes.

These proposed improvements are necessary to maintain the quality of sanitary sewer service for the project area's residents. The proposed selective replacement of defective sewer will mitigate the risk of complete failure of the sewer and possible spillage, and the proposed CIPP lining of sewer will prevent future failure of this sewer.

The proposed project is located in Census Tract 520.02 Block Group 3 and the project service area extends into a small portion of Census Tract 523.00 Block Group 2. An estimate of LMI individuals served based on the number of households within the project's service area is appended to Attachment B. Of the estimated 405 residents served by the proposed improvement, an estimated 278 (68.64%) residents are low and moderate-income individuals.



WHEREAS, there currently remains on deposit in the Borough's capital accounts excess bond proceeds allocable to the Ordinances (the "Excess Proceeds"), but no longer necessary to complete the improvements or purposes authorized therein; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the statutory powers set forth in section 39 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. (the "Local Bond Law"), the Borough

Council of the Borough has determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough to reappropriate the Excess Proceeds to finance the costs of the purchase of an ambulance by the Borough (the "New Purpose"), a purpose for which bonds may be issued under the Local Bond Law, thereby eliminating the need for the Borough to incur additional debt to finance such current capital needs; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough now desires to reappropriate the Excess Proceeds to undertake the New Purpose.

SECTION 2. The total amount of \$235,989.91 in Excess Proceeds is hereby reappropriated pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-39, and shall be used to finance the cost of the purchase of an ambulance by the Borough (the "New Purpose), which is a purpose for which bonds may be issued under the Local Bond Law. SECTION 6. The Borough covenants to maintain the exclusion from gross income under section 103(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, of the interest on all tax-exempt bond proceeds reappropriated by this bond ordinance.

SECTION 7. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after

the first publication hereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE NO. 24-05

BOROUGH OF NORTH PLAINFIELD COUNTY OF SOMERSET STATE OF NEW JERSEY

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, REVISE AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER 22 OF THE BOROUGH CODE, ENTITLED "LAND DEVELOPMENT", MORE SPECIFICALLY ARTICLE VIII, ENTITLED "ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT", AND MORE PARTICULARLY § 22-101, ENTITLED "WATER RUN-OFF CONTROL," MOST NOTABLY BY AMENDING, REVISING AND SUPPLEMENTING SECTION 22-101.2, ENTITLED "REGULATION" BY DELETING PARAGRAPH (f) THEREOF, ENTITLED "STORMWATER CONTROL" IN ITS ENTIRETY AND ENACTING A NEW PARAGRAPH (f), ENTITLED "STORMWATER CONTROL".

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield has previously enacted a Stormwater Management and Control Ordinance, which is now contained in the Borough of North Plainfield Code; and,

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) has provided supplemental and amendatory language to permit the Borough to make certain revisions to its Stormwater Management and Control Code provisions; and,

WHEREAS, the New Jersey State Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) has proposed a "streamlined" stormwater management ordinance, which would amend, revise and supplement Borough Code § 22-101.2(f), entitled "Stormwater Control", which the Borough desires to enact.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of North Plainfield, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that the Borough Code of the Borough of North Plainfield be amended, revised and supplemented as to Chapter 22, entitled "Land Development," and more particularly Section 22-101, entitled "Water Run-Off Control", most notably by amending, revising and supplementing Section 22-101.2, entitled "Regulation" by deleting the existing Paragraph (f) thereof, entitled "Stormwater Control" in its entirety, and enacting a new Paragraph (f) entitled "Stormwater Control."

(f.) Stormwater Control.

1. Scope and purpose.

A. Policy statement.

(1) Flood control, groundwater recharge, and pollutant reduction shall be achieved through the use of stormwater management measures, including Green Infrastructure

Best Management Practices (GI BMPs) and nonstructural stormwater management strategies. GI BMPs and low- impact development (LID) should be utilized to meet the goal of maintaining natural hydrology to reduce stormwater runoff volume, reduce erosion, encourage infiltration and groundwater recharge, and reduce pollution. GI BMPs and LID should be developed based upon physical site conditions and the origin, nature and the anticipated quantity, or amount, of potential pollutants. Multiple stormwater management BMPs may be necessary to achieve the established performance standards for green infrastructure, water quality, quantity, and groundwater recharge.

(2) <u>In addition to the proper design and construction of stormwater management facilities, continued inspection and maintenance will be required through the life of each facility.</u>

<u>This oversight includes periodic inspection of stormwater facilities and review of operation and maintenance records kept by each property owner, including inspection logs, maintenance records and stormwater facility location information.</u>

B. Purpose.

- (1) This ordinance is enacted in accordance with the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SPPP) of the Borough of North Plainfield and is enacted with the purpose to establish minimum stormwater management requirements and controls for "major development," as defined herein.
- (2) The Borough of North Plainfield is also subject to compliance with the New Jersey Municipal Stormwater Regulation Program. Under this program, the Borough of North Plainfield holds a municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) permit that requires the municipality to have a system of oversight in place to ensure adequate long-term operation and maintenance of stormwater facilities approved but not owned or operated by it. Stormwater facilities include, amongst other devices and structures, stormwater management basins.
- (3) A system of oversight is achieved by the implementation of local ordinances which are required by the MS4 permit with the legal authority being derived from the Federal Clean Water Act, the New Jersey Water Pollution Control Act and the New Jersey Stormwater Management Rules. The Borough's system of oversight requires collaboration with the owners or operators of stormwater facilities.
- (4) The Borough of North Plainfield also is establishing a policy for addressing stormwater management for development not meeting the criteria of major development. Design standards and design requirements not included herein may be found in a publication entitled "New Jersey Stormwater Best Management Practices Manual" (BMP Manual) that may be found at http://www.dep.nj.gov/stormwater/bmp-manual/.

The Stormwater Management Rules, *N.J.A.C.* 7:8, specify stormwater management standards that are mandatory in New Jersey for new major development. The BMP Manual was developed by the NJDEP to provide guidance to address the

standards in the Stormwater Management Rules, N.J.A.C. 7:8.

C. Applicability.

- (1) This ordinance shall be applicable to all site plans and subdivisions for developments that require either preliminary or final site plan or subdivision review:
- (2) This shall also be applicable to all major developments undertaken by the Borough of North Plainfield.
- (3) Applicability of this Ordinance to major developments shall comply with the last amended *N.J.A.C.* 7:8-1.6, incorporated herein by reference.
- (4) This Ordinance is applicable to developments that do not otherwise meet the NJDEP's definition of Major Development.
- D. Compatibility with other permit and ordinance requirements. Development approvals issued for subdivisions and site plans pursuant to this Ordinance are to be considered an integral part of development approvals under the subdivision and site plan review process and do not relieve the applicant of the responsibility to secure required permits or approvals for activities regulated by any other applicable code, rule, act, or ordinance. In their interpretation and application, the provisions of this Ordinance shall be held to be the minimum requirements for the promotion of the public health, safety, and general welfare. This Ordinance is not intended to interfere with, abrogate, or annul any other ordinances, rule or regulation, statute or other provision of law except that, where any provision of this Ordinance imposes restrictions different from those imposed by any other ordinance, rule or regulation, or other provision of law, the more restrictive provisions or higher standards shall control.

2. Definitions.

A. For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words, and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this ordinance clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future; words used in the plural number, include the singular number and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory. The definitions used in this Ordinance shall be the same as the last amended Stormwater Management Rules at *N.J.A.C.* 7:8-1.2, incorporated herein by reference.

3. Design and Performance Standards for Stormwater Management Measures.

A. This section establishes design and performance standards for stormwater management measures for major development intended to minimize the adverse impact of stormwater runoff on water quality and water quantity and loss of groundwater recharge in receiving water bodies. Design and performance standards for stormwater management measures shall comply with the last amended *N.J.A.C.* 7:8-5, incorporated herein by reference.

B. Minimum development design criteria. Development that does not meet the criteria of a major development shall address the requirements herein to the maximum extent practicable. At a minimum, applicants proposing such development shall document that there is no additional runoff draining to adjoining properties. Runoff from new impervious coverage shall be routed to the nearest street or municipal storm drainage system and not to adjacent properties.

4. Solids and Floatable Materials Control Standards:

- A. Site design features identified under Section 3 above, or alternative designs in accordance with Section 3 above, to prevent discharge of trash and debris from drainage systems shall comply with the following standard to control passage of solid and floatable materials through storm drain inlets. For purposes of this paragraph, "solid and floatable materials" means sediment, debris, trash and other floating, suspended, or settleable solids. For exemptions to this standard, see Section 4.A.2 below.
 - 1. Design engineers shall use one of the following grates whenever they use a grate in pavement or another ground surface to collect stormwater from that surface into a storm drain or surface water body under that grate:
 - i. The New Jersey State Department of Transportation (NJDOT) bicycle safe grate, which is described in Chapter 2.4 of the NJDOT Bicycle Compatible Roadways and Bikeways Planning and Design Guidelines; or,
 - ii. A different grate, if each individual clear space in that grate has an area of no more than seven (7.0) square inches, or is no greater than one-half (0.5) inches across the smallest dimension. Note that the Residential Site Improvement Standards at *N.J.A.C.* 5:21 include requirements for bicycle safe grates.
 - Examples of grates subject to this standard include grates in grate inlets, the grate portion (non-curb-opening portion) of combination inlets, grates on storm sewer manholes, ditch grates, trench grates and grates of spacer bars in slotted drains. Examples of ground surfaces include surfaces of roads (including bridges), driveways, parking areas, bikeways, plazas, sidewalks, lawns, fields, open channels and stormwater system floors used to collect stormwater from the surface into a storm drain or surface water body.
 - iii. For curb-opening inlets, including curb-opening inlets in combination inlets, the clear space in that curb opening, or each individual clear space if the curb opening has two or more clear spaces, shall have an area of no more than seven (7.0) square inches or be no greater than two (2.0) inches across the smallest dimension.
 - 2. The standard in Section 4.A.1. above does not apply:

- i. Where each individual clear space in the curb opening in existing curb-opening inlet does not have an area of more than nine (9.0) square inches;
- ii. Where the Borough agrees that the standards would cause inadequate hydraulic performance that could not practicably be overcome by using additional or larger storm drain inlets;
- iii. Where flows from the water quality design storm as specified in the last amended Stormwater Management rules at *N.J.A.C.* 7:8 et seq. are conveyed through any device (e.g., end of pipe netting facility, manufactured treatment device, or a catch basin hood) that is designed, at a minimum, to prevent delivery of all solid and floatable materials that could not pass through one of the following:
 - a. A rectangular space four and five-eighths (4.625) inches long and one and one-half (1.5) inches wide (this option does not apply for outfall netting facilities); or
 - b. A bar screen having a bar spacing of one-half (0.5) inches.

Note that these exemptions do not authorize any infringement of requirements in the Residential Site Improvement Standards for bicycle safe grates in new residential development (*N.J.A.C.* 5:21-4.18(b)2 and 7.4(b)1).

- iv. Where flows are conveyed through a trash rack that has parallel bars with oneinch (1 inch) spacing between the bars, to the elevation of the Water Quality Design Storm as specified in *N.J.A.C.* 7:8; or,
- v. Where the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection determines, pursuant to the New Jersey Register of Historic Places Rules at *N.J.A.C.* 7:4-7.2(c), that action to meet this standard is an undertaking that constitutes an encroachment or will damage or destroy the New Jersey Register listed historic property.

5. Safety Standards for Stormwater Management Basins:

A. This section sets forth requirements to protect public safety through the proper design and operation of stormwater management basins. This section applies to any new stormwater management basin. Safety standards for stormwater management measures shall comply with last amended *N.J.A.C.* 7:8-6, incorporated herein by reference.

6. Requirements for a Site Development Stormwater Plan:

A. <u>Submission of Site Development Stormwater Plan</u>

- 1. Whenever an applicant seeks municipal approval of a development subject to this ordinance, the applicant shall submit all of the required components of the Checklist for the Site Development Stormwater Plan at Section 6.C below as part of the submission of the application for approval.
- 2. The applicant shall demonstrate that the project meets the standards set forth in this ordinance.
- 3. The applicant shall submit two (2) copies of the materials listed in the checklist for site development stormwater plans in accordance with Section 6.C of this Ordinance.

B. Site Development Stormwater Plan Approval

The applicant's Site Development project shall be reviewed as a part of the review process by the municipal board or official from which municipal approval is sought. That municipal board or official shall consult the municipality's review engineer to determine if all of the checklist requirements have been satisfied and to determine if the project meets the standards set forth in this ordinance.

C. Submission of Site Development Stormwater Plan

The following information shall be required:

1. Topographic Base Map

The reviewing engineer may require upstream tributary drainage system information as necessary. It is recommended that the topographic base map of the site be submitted which extends a minimum of 200 feet beyond the limits of the proposed development, at a scale of 1"=200' or greater, showing 2-foot contour intervals. The map as appropriate may indicate the following: existing surface water drainage, shorelines, steep slopes, soils, erodible soils, perennial or intermittent streams that drain into or upstream of the Category One waters, wetlands and flood plains along with their appropriate buffer strips, marshlands and other wetlands, pervious or vegetative surfaces, existing man-made structures, roads, bearing and distances of property lines, and significant natural and manmade features not otherwise shown.

2. Environmental Site Analysis

A written and graphic description of the natural and man-made features of the site and its surroundings should be submitted. This description should include a discussion of soil conditions, slopes, wetlands, waterways and vegetation on the site. Particular attention should be given to unique, unusual, or environmentally sensitive features and to those that provide particular opportunities or constraints for development.

3. Project Description and Site Plans

A map (or maps) at the scale of the topographical base map indicating the location of existing and proposed buildings roads, parking areas, utilities, structural facilities for stormwater management and sediment control, and other permanent structures. The map(s) shall also clearly show areas where alterations will occur in the natural terrain and cover, including lawns and other landscaping, and seasonal high groundwater elevations. A written description of the site plan and justification for proposed changes in natural conditions shall also be provided.

4. <u>Land Use Planning and Source Control Plan</u>

This plan shall provide a demonstration of how the goals and standards of Section 3 above are being met. The focus of this plan shall be to describe how the site is being developed to meet the objective of controlling groundwater recharge, stormwater quality and stormwater quantity problems at the source by land management and source controls whenever possible.

5. Stormwater Management Facilities Map

The following information, illustrated on a map of the same scale as the topographic base map, shall be included:

i. Total area to be disturbed, paved or built upon, proposed surface contours, land area to be occupied by the stormwater management facilities and the type of

- vegetation thereon, and details of the proposed plan to control and dispose of stormwater.
- ii. Details of all stormwater management facility designs, during and after construction, including discharge provisions, discharge capacity for each outlet at different levels of detention and emergency spillway provisions with maximum discharge capacity of each spillway.

6. Calculations

- i. <u>Comprehensive hydrologic and hydraulic design calculations for the predevelopment and post-development conditions for the design storms specified in Section 3 of this Ordinance, above.</u>
- ii. When the proposed stormwater management control measures depend on the hydrologic properties of soils or require certain separation from the seasonal highwater table, then a soils report shall be submitted. The soils report shall be based on onsite boring logs or soil pit profiles. The number and location of required soil borings or soil pits shall be determined based on what is needed to determine the suitability and distribution of soils present at the location of the control measure.

7. <u>Maintenance and Repair Plan</u>

The design and planning of the stormwater management facility shall meet the maintenance requirements of Section 7 of this Ordinance below.

8. Waiver from Submission Requirements

The municipal official or board reviewing an application under this ordinance may, in consultation with the municipality's review engineer, waive submission of any of the requirements in Section 6.C.1 through 6.C.6 of this ordinance when it can be demonstrated that the information requested is impossible to obtain or it would create a hardship on the applicant to obtain and its absence will not materially affect the review process.

7. Maintenance and Repair.

- A. <u>Applicability</u>. Projects subject to review, as in § 22-101.2.f.1.C. of this Ordinance, shall comply with the requirements of the BMP Manual Appendix D, Section X B regarding general maintenance and Section X C regarding performance and maintenance guarantees.
- B. Inspection, oversight and owner responsibilities.
 - (1) All developments that contain stormwater management devices within the Borough are subject to the stormwater maintenance permit and periodic inspection in accordance with § 22-101.3 of the Borough Code.

- (2) The following requirements of *N.J.A.C.* 7:8-5.8 do not apply to stormwater management facilities that are dedicated to and accepted by the municipality or another governmental agency, subject to all applicable municipal stormwater general permit conditions, as issued by the Department:
 - i. If the maintenance plan identifies a person other than the property owner as having the responsibility for maintenance, the plan shall include documentation of such person's or entity's agreement to assume this responsibility, or of the owner's obligation to dedicate a stormwater management facility to such person under an applicable ordinance or regulation; and,
 - ii. Responsibility for maintenance shall not be assigned or transferred to the owner or tenant of an individual property in a residential development or project, unless such owner or tenant owns or leases the entire residential development or project. The individual property owner may be assigned incidental tasks, such as weeding of green infrastructure BMP, provided the individual agrees to assume these tasks; however, the individual cannot be legally responsible for all of the maintenance required.
- (3) In the event that the stormwater management facility becomes a danger to public safety or public health, or if it is in need of maintenance or repair, the municipality shall so notify the responsible person in writing. Upon receipt of that notice, the responsible person shall have fourteen (14) calendar days to effect maintenance and repair of the facility in a manner that is approved by the Borough engineer or his designee. The Borough, in its discretion, may extend the time allowed for effecting maintenance and repair for good cause. If the responsible person fails or refuses to perform such maintenance and repair, the Borough or Somerset County may immediately proceed to do so and shall bill the cost thereof to the responsible person. Nonpayment of such bill may result in a lien on the property.
- (4) Nothing in this section shall preclude the Borough from requiring the posting of a performance or maintenance guaranty in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40:55D-53.

8. Violations and penalties.

A. General penalty. Any person who erects, constructs, alters, repairs, converts, maintains, or uses any building, structure or land in violation of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to the penalty stated in § 22-101.3 of the Borough Code.

9. Severability.

Each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase, and the finding or holding of any such portion of this ordinance to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause, or reason, shall not affect any other portion of this ordinance.

10. Effective date.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and any publication as required by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall take effect, after final passage, twenty (20) days following action or inaction by the Mayor as provided by law or an override of a mayoral veto by the Council, whichever is applicable and publication in accordance with law, unless a resolution is adopted, pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40:69A-181(b), declaring an emergency and providing that this Ordinance shall take effect at an earlier date.
