AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, REVISE AND SUPPLEMENT ARTICLE I OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE OF THE BOROUGH CODE, ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATIVE CODE", MORE SPECIFICALLY CHAPTER 2-6, ENTITLED "DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION," AND MORE PARTICULARLY § 2-6.5, ENTITLED "ESTABLISHMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION COMMITTEE,"

WHEREAS, § 2-6.5 of the Borough Code of the Borough of North Plainfield authorizes the Mayor to appoint a Parks and Recreation Committee; and,

WHEREAS, after proper investigation, the Mayor's Office has determined that the Parks and Recreation Committee has performed outstanding work for the benefit of residents of the Borough of North Plainfield; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor's Office has determined that the Parks and Recreation Committee should be restructured to be able to continue its work in a more streamlined and timely fashion; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council finds it necessary and appropriate to amend, revise and supplement § 2-6.5 of the Borough Code regarding the Mayor's Parks and Recreation Committee to restructure the Parks and Recreation Committee to be able to continue its work in a more streamlined and timely fashion.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of North Plainfield, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that the Borough Code of the Borough of North Plainfield be amended, revised and supplemented as to Article I of the Administrative Code of the Borough Code, entitled "Administrative Code", more specifically Chapter 2-6, entitled

"Department of Administration," and more particularly § 2-6.5, entitled "Establishment of Parks and Recreation Committee," as follows:

§ 2-6.5 Establishment of Parks and Recreation Committee.

- a. There is hereby established a Parks and Recreation Committee.
- b. Membership. The Parks and Recreation Committee shall consist of <u>five (5)</u> <u>13</u> voting members, who shall be residents of the Borough and who shall be appointed by the Mayor, which appointments do not require the consent of the Borough Council. The members of the Parks and Recreation Committee shall not receive compensation for their services. Each member of the Parks and Recreation Committee shall, before assuming office, take and subscribe an oath that he or she will faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of the appointment.
- c. Counsel Liaison. The Borough Council shall appoint one of its members to be a liaison to the Parks and Recreation Committee for a term of one year beginning on January 1 and terminating on December 31 of each year. The Council Liaison shall not be a voting member of the Parks and Recreation Committee.
- d. Terms of Office; Vacancies.
 - 1. The appointments by the Mayor to establish the initial membership of the Parks and Recreation Committee shall be as follows: (1) Existing Parks and Recreation Committee members as of the passage of the Ordinance 2018-03; and, (2) three members who shall be appointed as follows: (a) two members whose terms shall expire January 1, 2020; and, (b) one member whose term shall expire January 1, 2021. Two (2) members of the Parks and Recreation Committee shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years; two (2) members of the Parks and Recreation Committee shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years; and, one (1) member of the Parks and Recreation Committee shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year.

g. Mayor's Special Events. In addition to those powers and duties outlined above, act as the Mayor's Special Events Committee to plan and, where applicable, organize, supervise and control special events for the Borough residents at the behest of the Mayor, subject to the availability of funding from the Borough.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall take

effect, after final passage, twenty (20) days following action or inaction by the Mayor as provided by law or an override of a mayoral veto by the Council, whichever is applicable and publication in accordance with law, unless a resolution is adopted, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:69A-181(b), declaring an emergency and providing that this Ordinance shall take effect at an earlier date. AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, REVISE AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER 7A OF THE BOROUGH CODE, ENTITLED "TRAFFIC SCHEDULES", MORE SPECIFICALLY CHAPTER 7A-2, ENTITLED "SCHEDULE II, NO PARKING."

WHEREAS, § 7-3.4 of the Borough Code of the Borough of North Plainfield provides that parking shall be prohibited at all times upon certain streets or parts thereof as specified in Schedule II of Chapter 7A of the Borough Code; and,

WHEREAS, after proper investigation, the County of Somerset and the North Plainfield Police Department have determined that parking along Watchung Avenue at or near its intersection with Jackson Avenue and Mountain Avenue at or near its intersection with Westervelt Avenue in the Borough of North Plainfield, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey should be modified to increase sight distances along said intersections to increase vehicular safety and reduce the potential for accidents; and,

WHEREAS, such locations are described in Schedule II of Chapter 7A of the Borough Code; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough finds it necessary and appropriate to amend, revise and supplement Schedule II of Chapter 7A-2 of the Borough Code regarding prohibited parking at all times upon certain streets or parts thereof to provide for adequate sight lines as aforesaid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of North Plainfield, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that the Borough Code of the Borough of North Plainfield be amended, revised and supplemented as to Chapter 7A of the Borough Code,

ORDINANCE NO. 24-09

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, REVISE AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER 7 OF THE BOROUGH CODE, ENTITLED "TRAFFIC", AND MORE SPECIFICALLY § 7-3, ENTITLED "PROHIBITED PARKING", AND MORE PARTICULARLY § 7-3.8, ENTITLED "PARKING OF VEHICLES ON FRONT YARDS".

WHEREAS, pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40:48-1 and *N.J.S.A.* 40:48-2, the governing body of a municipality may make, amend, repeal and enforce such ordinances, regulations, rules and bylaws not contrary to the laws of this State and/or of the United States, as it may deem necessary and proper for the good of government, order and protection of person and property and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the municipality and its inhabitants and, as may be necessary to carry into effect the powers and duties conferred and imposed by this subtitle, or by any other law; and,

WHEREAS, this grant of authority includes the power to adopt reasonable ordinances for the regulation of parking of any vehicle on any public street, highway or public right-of-way located in the geographic boundaries of the Borough of North Plainfield; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has received complaints, by email, telephone and at public Council meetings, of vehicles along the side of Borough roadways without curbing and with all, or part, of their wheels located off the paved portion of the road and on grass or other treatments of the land adjacent to the paved roadway; and,

WHEREAS, parking of vehicles along the side of Borough roadways without curbing and with all, or part, of their wheels located off the paved portion of the road and on grass or other surfaces of the land, creating damage to by rutting and/or other disturbances of grass or other ground surfaces and which may cause oil, gas, grease or coolant to leak from such vehicles into the unpaved groundcover adjacent to the paved roadway, creating the potential for environmental pollution and stormwater contamination; and,

WHEREAS, the New Jersey State Legislature, by creating laws codified at *N.J.S.A.* 39:4-135(1)(f), has permitted municipalities to adopt ordinances prohibiting parking with wheels off the paved portion of roadways without curbing on any public street, highway and/or public right-of-way in the municipality, including the Borough of North Plainfield; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield hereby declares that such parking of vehicles off the public roadway along streets without curbs is a threat to the public health, safety or welfare; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council finds it necessary and appropriate to amend, revise and supplement Chapter Three of the Borough Code by enacting a new § 7-3.8(B) of the Borough Code regarding parking off the paved roadway on any public street, highway and/or public right-of-way in the Borough of North Plainfield.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of North Plainfield, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that the Borough Code of the Borough of North Plainfield be amended, revised and supplemented as to Chapter 7 of the Borough Code, entitled "Traffic," and more specifically § 7-3, entitled "Prohibited Parking", and more particularly § 7-3.8, entitled "Parking of Vehicles on Front Yards", as follows:

§ 7-3.8 Parking of Vehicles on Front Yards or Off Paved Roadway.

- A. No owner of any vehicle that is or is required to be registered and/or licensed by the Motor Vehicle Commission or equivalent agency as a vehicle may park that vehicle on that portion of the front yard which is directly in front of any principal structure, as defined in § 22-3, of any premises located in a residential district except for an attached and front-facing garage. Such vehicles include by way of example, but not by limitation, automobiles, trucks, buses, vans, sport utility vehicles, motorcycles, boats, and trailers. This section shall not be construed to preclude the parking of vehicles on the driveway area of the property as set forth in §§ 22-117.2 and 22-117.4. The person/entity responsible for the enforcement of this section shall be the North Plainfield Police Department and/or the Code Enforcement Officer of the Borough of North Plainfield or their designee.
- B. No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle in a roadway in a residential area, other than on the actual paved roadway parallel with the edge of the paved roadway headed in the direction of traffic, on the right-hand side of the paved roadway and with the curb side of the vehicle no more than six (6) inches away from the meeting of the edge of the paved roadway with the unpaved ground adjacent to the roadway. The person/entity responsible for the enforcement of this section shall be the North Plainfield Police Department and/or the Code Enforcement Officer of the Borough of North Plainfield or their designee.
- C. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Section shall, upon conviction of same, be subject to a penalty as established in Chapter 1, Section 1-5 of the Borough Code."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall take effect, after final passage, twenty (20) days following action or inaction by the Mayor as provided by law or an override of a mayoral veto by the Council, whichever is applicable and publication in accordance with law, unless a resolution is adopted, pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40:69A-181(b), declaring an emergency and providing that this Ordinance shall take effect at an earlier date.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND ACTING MUNICIPAL CLERK TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH PHILLIPS, PREISS, GRYGIEL, LEHENY & HUGHES, L.L.C., FOR THE PREPARATION OF THE 2024 MASTER PLAN RE-EXAMINATION.

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield (the "Borough") is required, pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40:55D-28 and Borough Code § 22-35 to provide for a general re-examination of the Master Plan and the Borough Code regarding development by the North Plainfield Planning Board (the "Planning Board"); and,

WHEREAS, the Planning Board is required to prepare a report on the findings of the reexamination for the Borough Council ("Council"); and,

WHEREAS, the statutory six (6) year period for the preparation of a re-examination of such plan and development regulations is approaching; and,

WHEREAS, the preparation of a Master Plan Re-Examination Report requires the examination and assessment of technical planning and zoning aspects in and about the Borough, including, but not limited to, major problems and objectives relating to land development in the Borough, if any; the extent to which such problems and objectives have been reduced or have increased subsequent to such date; the extent to which there have been significant changes in the assumptions, policies and/or objectives forming the basis for such plan or regulations as last revised, with particular regard to the density and distribution of population and land uses, housing conditions, circulation, conservation of natural resources and changes in State, County and Borough policies and objectives; the specific changes recommended for such plan or regulations, if any, including underlying objectives, policies and standards or whether a new plan or regulations should be prepared, all of which require the services of professionals to assist the Borough and the Board; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning and Real Estate Consulting Firm of Phillips, Preiss, Grygiel, Leheny & Hughes, L.L.C., has submitted a proposal for all professional services for the preparation and presentation of the Borough's Master Plan Re-Evaluation, in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 40:55D-28 and Borough Code § 22-35, a copy of said proposal being maintained in the office of the Acting Municipal Clerk and the contents of which are incorporated herein, with a scope of work to include:

1. Reviewing the current Master Plan documents and existing Zoning Ordinance regulations;

- 2. Meeting with municipal representatives to discuss issues and areas of concern related to planning, zoning and development;
- 3. Attending one (1) Planning Board meeting to discuss planning, zoning and development issues and opportunities to be considered in the Reexamination;
- 4. Preparing a Reexamination of the Master Plan for submission to the Planning Board;
- 5. Attending one (1) Planning Board meeting to present the reexamination to the Board and public;
- 6. Working with the Planning Board to determine changes recommended for the Master Plan and development regulations, as well as any other relevant recommendations; and,
